"Being a volunteer (since I was 8 now I'm 15 years old), I have learned the key thing of caring for others, before myself. Helping others makes me feel happy when they are happy. This makes me feel like I'm a better person...Giving back to the community is very important and Project Dana is one opportunity where we can give back."

"My story began in March 2009 when Project Dana requested help for a 94 year old woman who had just been discharged from the hospital after colon cancer surgery and needed help going to the doctor for follow up visits. Now we have become lifelong dear friends and I still visit her every month. She calls me her "angel" and I cherish her friendship and admire and look up to her as an inspiration to be like her when I reach her age. She is 98 now and the rose plant that she sprouted for me is now as tall as I am growing in pot at my front door and the delicate pink roses remind me of this fabulous woman that I would not have met had I not been a Project Dana volunteer."

"Working with L. has been a life changing experience for me. I have learned not only how to care for someone passionately but also made me realize how fortunate I am to have people care and love me because some people don't have someone to be there for them. I am glad I could work with L. because she taught me how to be grateful, compassionate, and thankful of everything I have. This learning experience has been fulfilling for me because I can grasp a great understanding of the hands on need to care for someone and it changed me emotionally and mentally."

HEALTH & WELLNESS

Welcome to the New Year! Let us hope that 2015, the year of the Sheep (or Ram), will keep us healthy and wise. Let's try to keep our mind, soul and body healthy by exercising and by sharing our gratitude with others.



May I share some information with you on Vitamin D. Tufts University's *Health and Nutrition* Letter contained an article by Robin Kanarek, PhD, who stated that Vitamin D is critical for the normal functioning of our nervous system. She explains that Vitamin D deficiency may contribute to age-related decline in mental activities (such as thinking, remembering, learning or using language). She states, "It is possible that Vitamin D deficiency is the consequence rather than the cause of decline in o f cognitive behavior elderly individuals. Why? Because as we age, we tend to reduce the time spent in physical activities, especially outdoors in the sunshine and the reduced Vitamin D metabolism "

Dr. Kanarek feels that more studies are needed. However, based on the article, it is suggested that we should continue to move around and if possible, spend some time outdoors in the sunshine.
