With the guidance and recommendations from the CDC regarding the COVID-19 and faith based organizations, <u>Moiliili Hongwanji will be cancelling Sunday Services</u>, <u>effective</u> <u>March 16, 2020 at least until April 5, 2020</u>. Hopefully, we can resume services starting on April 12.

Private memorial services may still be conducted at the discretion of the minister.

All nursing home visits by the minister have been cancelled for the month of March.

During the duration of the Sunday service cancellation, the office and columbarium will be open as usual during normal hours.
